HONORING THE MEMORY OF FRITZ "FRITZ FROG" VORDERMARK

Fritz Vordermark began his early childhood education journey at EELC in August 2019 when he enrolled in the Hummingbirds infant classroom. As he grew and developed over the years, Fritz transitioned to the Rainbow, Yellow House, and Maple Tree classrooms. While attending EELC in the Maple Tree classroom, Fritz was diagnosed with an ultra-rare, noninherited genetic mutation that caused complex epilepsy. After his courageous two year battle, Fritz peacefully passed away in his home with his loving family on August 13, 2024.

During his time at EELC, Fritz touched the lives of many staff members and classmates. Staff quickly noticed Fritz's love for music. He was frequently seen entertaining his class with his infamous dance moves and sharing his musical talents by playing instruments with classmates. He was such a joy to have at EELC and his bright, joyous spirit will live on here forever.

Following his passing, Fritz's parents asked that anyone who felt compelled to make a donation in Fritz's memory make it towards a special fund at EELC in Fritz's memory. As a result, an outpouring of donations of over \$50,000 flooded in over a few weeks. Thank you to everyone who so generously gave to the EELC Fritz Frog Fund.

IT'S TIME TO GROW! MUSTACHES FOR KIDS LYNCHBURG





EELC IMPLEMENTS NEW CURRICULUM

EELC is now using the STREAMin3 Curriculum, an innovative curriculum model developed by researchers at the University of Virginia. In the STREAMin3 Curriculum, children think big, solve problems, and explore their world. This sets them up for success in kindergarten and beyond. The STREAM skills are taught through hands-on experiences in Learning Centers in the classroom and outdoors through interactions that are intentional and integrated throughout the day, across all ages and skills.



STREAM represents:

Science – Children use their senses to explore and understand the world. The Science Center includes plants and animals, sensory materials, magnets, and collections of nature items. Our outdoor classroom includes a large variety of trees, including an apple and fig tree, blackberry bushes, a pollinator garden, a sandbox and water tables.

Technology – Children use tools to create, explore, and innovate. Technology materials include magnifying glasses, droppers, tweezers, tools, and simple machines.

Reading – Children learn letters, sounds, rhymes, print, and early writing. The Reading Center includes books, writing materials, puppets, and flannel board stories.



Engineering – Children discover how and why things work. The Engineering Center includes blocks of varying size, shape and material, simple machines, vehicles, Legos, Magna-Tiles, play people and animals.

<u>Art</u> – Children create, express, and imagine. Centers include paint, markers, crayons, scissors, glue, play-dough, costumes and props, and musical instruments.

Math − Children explore numbers, shapes, spatial sense, patterns and measurement. The Math Center includes manipulatives to count, sort and compare, puzzles, balance scales, 2D and 3D shapes, and math games.

All activities are designed to help children relate to their friends and teachers, regulate their emotions, attention and behavior, think about and make sense of the world around them, use language to communicate needs and share their ideas, and move their bodies to achieve their goals and care for themselves.

In the first five years of life, the human brain grows more than at any other point in life. The STREAMin3 Curriculum is designed to capitalize on this. Based on the latest research, it taps into how children learn best. <u>Every moment of every day is a learning experience for the children at EELC!</u>
